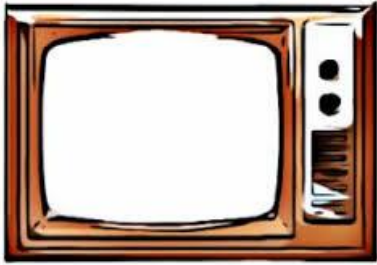
UPCOMING Events
