The first Show took place in 1858 initially on a Tuesday, on land just next to the Royal Hotel, before moving to its existing location at Kings Park in 1904. The Society is the longest serving community based organisation in the district and continues to play a significant role in the fabric of our community. Jason acknowledged the important role that Rotary members, past and present, have played with current members, Vivian Beaumont, Bryan Tehan, David Freeman and Taylan Atar playing at active and important role in the Society's current activity. The past involvement of the McLarty, Greenshields and Wales families were also acknowledged.

The 2016 show which will take place on the evening of 30 September and 1 October, will continue the recent growth with the schedule including :
