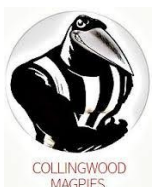

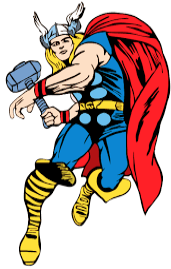
ROTARY SEYMOUR WEEKLY LUCKY WHEEL
